
A glimpse of His Glory!..

This comes to you with love and prayers from me at this strange and unusual time in the life of our church.

We often say that 'the Church is the people not the buildings' and boy, is this a time to put that to the test!

Community is at the heart of our values as a parish and as the body of Christ, of which we all play our part, at St Stephen's. Keeping us connected to God and each other is of paramount importance throughout 'lockdown' and even more importantly as we begin to step into a new way of being together again. I hope and pray that this is a time that draws us closer together as a community, even as we are physically apart.

This new booklet contains prayers for a time of worship for each day of the week. On Sunday, there is a page of Bible verses that we would have shared together in Church, If you are in any doubt of how to find them in the Bible, then either check out page 8 of the first prayer booklet you received, 'Prayers in Isolation...a Special Time with God', or give me a ring and I will be more than happy to help. It is my hope that in using these, and in keeping in touch with one another by phone or text or WhatsApp or via Facebook (why not ask to join our community Facebook page = St stephen's Church Community), we cannot just keep going as a church, but grow in our faith and love.

Establishing regular habits of prayer when everything else is stripped away is part of our DNA as Christians, so this is an ideal time to focus on and develop our spiritual disciplines.

So, I invite you if you're able to try to use some or all of these prayers or other worship resources daily; and if possible, to do so at 9am during the week, and at 10am on Sundays. Or, if like me you join a service online on Sundays, then why not try the one in this booklet at another time of the day.

I find it helpful to set aside specific times of the day and week to pray and worship. I also seek out a quiet place at home and invite the rest of the household to join me, if they want to. I also find it helpful to light a candle to create a prayerful atmosphere, and have a cross, or an icon, or a statue of Jesus to use as a focus for my prayers.

BBC One broadcasts Songs of Praise every Sunday at 1.15pm and the BBC have said they will also broadcast a Sunday morning service – check listings. There is a daily service on Radio 4 every morning at 9.45am.

During your time on the phone with your 'Care 5' friends as part of 'Phone Church' you might also choose to pray together as part of your chatting and share with one another how you feel God is with you during this time. In this way you will be a great encouragement in keeping connected to each other and with God.

Please be assured of the continuing prayers of your Church family at St Stephen's and of the love and longing there is for us to be back together again. As we praise God in our worship times, let us join together in continuing to pray for one another.
