**KNOWING JESUS... MAKING JESUS KNOWN!** 



**D**URING Lent, St Stephens Soundwell has had the opportunity to run the 'Talking Jesus' Lent course.

THIS course has given us the privilege to listen to other people's stories about their faith and their relationship with God. It has also highlighted the importance of talking about Jesus to our friends, families and to people who we do not know.

Talking about Jesus to people is no easy task and it requires faith and bravery.

What people think about us and the fear of rejection are issues that many people deal with on a day to day basis.

These issues have an effect on us when we try to speak about Jesus to those who we meet daily.

However, the amazing story of Jesus has the ability to change the hearts of people and ultimately, it highlights the amazing love that God has for each one of us.

ON 31st of March, the church celebrated **Easter Day** which is the time when we remember the resurrection of Jesus three days after he was killed.

The week before Easter is known as Holy Week and it begins with Palm Sunday which is the time when Jesus rode into Jerusalem on a donkey.

The crowds who saw this began to break branches and palm leaves off the trees and they began to shout:

"Hosanna to the Son of David! Blessed is the one who comes in the name of the Lord! Hosanna in the highest heaven!" as Jesus rode into Jerusalem.

Though this was a celebration, Jesus was about to face the final week of his ministry as he was about to be betrayed, falsely accused, arrested and crucified.

As I think about **Holy Week**, I can just imagine the emotions that Jesus must have been facing at that point in time.

Just before going to the garden of Gethsemane, Jesus shared the Last Supper with his disciples and at the supper, he clearly states that one of his disciples will soon betray him. This in itself must have felt tremendously heart-breaking.

Following this, Jesus then heads to the garden of Gethsemane. To see the disciples asleep as he prayed in the garden and then to see Judas betray him with a kiss must have really impacted his emotions and added to his heartbreak.

As we travel our faith journey, we often face challenges and go through situations in which we feel like nobody understands us and nobody understands the way we feel. Through everything that Jesus went through, we can take comfort that he understands us when we feel betrayed, angry, heartbroken or fearful.

Whenever we feel misunderstood or whenever we feel distant from God, may we remember the Easter story and may we know that Jesus knows and understands exactly how we feel.

ON Good Friday, we have a service at church entitled 'The Last Hour at the Cross', which helps us to focus on that final hour at the cross before Jesus died.



At this point, it looks as if Christ has been defeated and it looks as if his ministry and teachings have all come to an end. But after three days, the tomb where Jesus's body was laid to rest is found empty.

Jesus then appears to his disciples and shows them that he is alive, thus proving that he really did have the power to conquer death.

The Easter story is a story with great emotions as we learn about the Son of God who was crucified for our sins. However, this story is one that leaves us with a great sense of joy and of hope as we look to the future.

The death and resurrection of Jesus has blessed and impacted our lives in a way that nothing else can ever compare to what Jesus has done for us.

Through his death and resurrection, we can be assured that all our sins and mistakes are forgiven and because of this, we do not have to feel the guilt and the shame of things we have done in the past.

Through his resurrection and bursting from the tomb, we can look to the future with hope knowing that we have a heavenly home in which we will spend eternity with God our loving father and Jesus our King and Saviour.

THE 'Talking Jesus' Lent course left us with a challenge of not only talking about Jesus to those around us but also the challenge of praying for 5 people. Likewise, Jesus left us with a challenge before his ascension into

In the last verses of the Gospel of Matthew, Jesus gives us a challenge that is known as the Great Commission. His words state:

'All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me.

Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptising them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything that I have commanded you.

And remember, I am with you always, to the end of the age.'

I believe that the challenges of both the Lent course and the Great Commission apply to every Christian. However, both challenges require a bold response from us because often, we may feel like we don't have the right words to say to people or we may feel like we do not have the right gifts to speak to people and therefore they may not listen to us.

I remember the first time I arrived to do prison ministry, I was not very confident, and I did not know if I was able to do what God was asking me to do.

It is important to remember that each one of us has a story and this story is unique because it is our own personal story.

It is also important to remember those comforting last words of Jesus in the Great Commission which he states, 'Tam with you always'.'

As we daily live out our faith and as we share our experience of Jesus with people, we may sometimes face challenges such as feelings of being outside our comfort zones.

During times like these, may we take comfort in those words of Jesus. May we know deep in our hearts that the Son of God gave his life for each one of us because we are God's beloved children.

Finally, may we never forget that fesus is with us always.

## Word for today

MY usually connecting with God routines, begin with a morning chat with the Lord before I even get out of bed!

AS WELL as daily Morning and Evening Prayer, for which I tend to switch between Common Worship and various versions of Celtic Daily Prayer, I also read a bite size of Scripture which comes with a thought for the day, produced by UCB Word for Today, normally as I am munching on my breakfast.

The following is taken from one of my recent 'daily readings'. I found it helpful in thinking about my finances, so I thought I would share it with you!

## What the Bible teaches us about money:

'Though your riches increase, do not set your heart on them.'
(PSALM 6:10 NIV)

Let's settle it once and for all. If God can trust you with something small, He will trust you with more (see LUKE 16:10, 2 & CORINTHIANS 9:6-11).

BUT His blessings come with certain conditions, and here are four you need to honour.

#### 1) Don't try to claim credit.

God told the Israelites:

'You may say to yourself: 'My hands have produced this wealth for me.'

But remember the Lord... for it is he who gives you the ability to produce wealth... If you ever forget... you will surely be destroyed'

(DEUTERONOMY8:17-19 NIV).

#### 2) Don't forget others.

The Bible commands 'those who are rich in this present world...to put their hope in God, who richly provides us with everything for our enjoyment. Command them to do good, to be rich in good deeds...generous and willing to share. In this way they will lay up treasure for themselves'

(ITIMOTHY 6:17-19 NIV).

#### 3) Don't become arrogant.

Jeremiah admonishes us, 'Let not the wise boast of their wisdom or the strong, of their strength or the rich...of their riches, but let the one who boasts boast about this: that they have the understanding to know me, that I am the Lord'. (JEREMIAH 9:23-24 NIV).

### 4) Don't allow anything to take God's place.

'Give me neither poverty nor riches, but give me only my daily bread. Otherwise, I may have too much and disown you and say, "Who is the Lord?" (PROVERBS 30:8-9 NIV).

REMEMBER, you don't own anything—you're just an administrator of God's estate and an executor of His will.

It's an awesome responsibility, so make sure you do a good job.

And another one that spoke strongly to me...

Give your worries to God:

"The peace of God...will guard your hearts and minds."

(PHILIPPIANS 4:7 NIV).

WHEN you feel anxious and afraid, here are two things you should do:

#### 1) Find a 'faith friend'.

When anxiety grabs your mind, one of the most powerful ways to break the worry spiral is to disclose it to a 'faith friend'. When Israel went out to occupy the promised land, here is what God said to them:

'Is anyone afraid or fainthearted? Let him go home so that his fellow soldiers will not become disheartened too' (DEUTERONOMY 20:8 NIV).

Pessimism, fright, and discouragement are contagious.

And so is courage!

2) Take action and face your fear. Sermons about how God will take care of you aren't in and of themselves sufficient to remove anxiety from your

life. You must do certain things, like stepping out in trust.

to trust Him to the point where you

The way to get God's peace from your head to the rest of your body is

can confront your fears head-on. So, with that in mind:

a) Meditate on passages like Psalm 23; imagine yourself being shepherded by the Lord through green pastures and led beside still waters.

- b) Talk to your 'faith friend' before worry gets a foothold in your mind.
- c) Use a 'breath prayer' such as, 'God, I'm casting all my cares on You'
- d) Exercise; physical exercise is one of the best ways to stop excess adrenaline from building up.
- e) Identify your fear and take even one small step towards confronting it, and--
- f) Get sufficient rest. David said, 'In peace I will lie down and sleep, for you alone, Lord, make me dwell in safety' (PSALM 4:8 NIV).


