Even those of us for whom it has great meaning will admit that memories of past Holy Weeks and Easter Sundays can blur into each other.

But that is just the day.

Easter really only happens for any of us when we make it so, when we build it for ourselves, when we accept that it requires us to do something too.

God's gift in Jesus requires nothing from us, it's completely free but it isn't something that's forced on us either.

I believe God knows and loves every one of us just as we are and holds out all we need to get to know him too but we have to accept the gift and say yes.

A relationship with anyone requires both people to be involved; for each to play a part.


So, whether you're reading this before or after the Easter weekend, I hope that you will choose to explore the story and join in with all that it offers not just on the big day but on any and every day.

Remember Holy Week

I KNOW that as I write this, it isn't going to be quite Easter when you read Open Space, but let me say it anyway...

Happy Easter! Christ is Risen! He is risen indeed. Alleluia!

BUT before we have Easter, we have to have Holy Saturday, Good Friday, Maundy Thursday, and we have to have Palm Sunday. Without those preceding days, there is no Easter Sunday.

Without the procession of arriving in Jerusalem, the last supper, the arrest, the mocking, the beating, the Cross, the tomb... there is no resurrection.

So, we have to go through Holy Week to get to Easter Sunday.

This Easter time, don't jump from Palm Sunday (2nd April) with our celebration of Jesus arrival in Jerusalem on a donkey, straight to Easter Sunday (9th April), with our celebration of his resurrection... remember also Holy Week (the week inbetween). **Ponder, pray and reflect.**

Perhaps you may wish to come to meander through the **Experience Easter** Trail, which will be in the grounds of the church throughout Holy Week.

Why not be part of the 'foot washing' as we remember and relive some of the events of the Last Supper – in Church, 7.30pm on Maundy Thursday (6th April).

Although many places sell them all year round, hot cross buns are traditionally eaten on Good Friday (7th April). The cross on the top is a reminder of the cross on which Jesus died, and the spices are a reminder of the spices used in his burial.

In Church, we will be remembering this most Holy of days, with 'Quiet reflection' in church from 1–2pm.

Then a service of prayer, scripture, space and song, as we remember **The Last Hour** of our Lord's life, given for us upon a cross of wood.

While you are in church on Good Friday, why not look around the church building and see how many crosses you can find.

Or you might wish to add one you have made to be part of the Easter Trail. Even if you're not in church,

learn to spot crosses everywhere: window frames, aeroplane trails... there will be crosses everywhere! Many people wear a cross as jewellery (I have them in my ears and round my neck), some people carry a small cross in their pocket or bag.

At a Christening, the priest will draw the sign of the cross on the child's forehead – the cross is a sign of belonging to God, and of the love that God has for us.

One of the most famous bible verses says, 'God so loved the world that he gave his only Son' (JOHN 3:16). New parents probably understand this sort of love better than anyone: the love that means you would do anything and everything for the sake of your child.

We can pray 'Our Father', because God loves us like that – Jesus' death on the cross was God being willing to do anything and everything for our sake, because he loves us.

Another way to mark Good Friday might be to make an Easter Garden. There will be one in our Experience Easter Trail, but why not make one for yourself? This can be anything from a simple plant pot 'garden' to something much more ambitious. Usually an Easter garden includes a hill with three crosses on it, and a cave/tomb (often a smaller plant pot laid on its side) with a stone against it. Some gardens also add a path made of gravel, and spring flowers such as primroses.

You can even make an Easter garden picture instead if you don't have the materials to make a 3D one from natural objects.

When you make the garden, put the stone in front of the cave. On Easter Sunday, roll the stone to one side (or peel it off if you made a picture) to help tell the Easter story.

So, this Easter time, don't jump from Palm Sunday, straight to Easter Sunday... ponder, pray and reflect.

And in doing so, let us remember what Jesus did for us on the cross.

And let us know in our hearts and minds that while we have to go through the pain of Holy Week, Easter Sunday will always follow!

Young Carers – Bristol & South Glos is a charity that supports children and young people, aged 8–18, who provide substantial care for someone in their family who has a disability, a long-term illness, or is affected by mental ill health or substance misuse.

They are often the 'hidden' carers and can themselves suffer from bullying, isolation and tiredness, as well as a whole host of other issues, because of all they do for others. Many people don't know of this charity and all the great work they do to support the 'Young Carers', so why not mention it to your friends, drop it into your conversations to raise awareness of and for them.





I don't know about you, but I benefited from some really tasty cake on the day, a cup of tea served with a smile and polite and caring young people who helped clear everything away. 'The leaders of Youth Church did a fabulous job to make this happen. So, thank you to all of you'.

Special thanks too, to Lauren, who spoke from her heart and of her own experience of being a young carer for her Mum.

Thank you to her Mum, Sarah, for liaising with the 'Young Carers' charity for us and ensuring they received all your donations.

Sarah said, 'It was so lovely doing the cake sale today for young carers. Lauren and I had a wonderful time and it looks like everyone else did too'. And I think we all did!!

Thank you also to YOU, for giving as generously as you did.

Ways of Giving to God, through Church

BEING 'Thankful and Grateful' to God for all that He has freely given to us, both in provision for all our needs AND in Jesus, means that we, like Him, become a Generous people.

WE are called to make Christ known and loved. To do that, costs money. Some costs are obvious, like heat and light in Church and maintenance of the building. Other costs include paying our 'Parish Share', which allows for clergy to be recruited, and training and resources needed to keep Church fresh, relevant – and growing.

Our building was paid for by our forebears many years ago. It is only here today, because it has been carefully maintained by generations of faithful Christians here in Soundwell. Without our Generosity, the Church collapses, and with it, all the amazing work we do in the Lord's name here, and further afield.

There are many ways to Give to God through Church. You can put money in weekly collection plates, or use the QR code displayed on the stands to give via smart phone, or use the donations machine near the Font to give via bank or credit card or from your phone.

To enable us to budget and forecast we can pay our bills, we highly commend the first of these 2 options:

- **1.** Use the **Parish Giving Scheme** (PGS), which is a regular direct debit from your bank each month which enables you to review annually and also avoids scrabbling for weekly cash or needing to remember!
- 2. Request **Special Collection Envelopes**, so you can enclose your donation every week and just take them all to Church when you can.
