A WEEK or so ago, the schools 'brokeup' for the summer holidays, and St Stephen's Junior School, along with other primary schools in the area, said their goodbyes to their Year 6 pupils.

THIS IS OFTEN an event with mixed emotions... as at the end of every summer term; there is joy and elation at breaking up for the summer, and also sadness about being separated for the long summer holiday. This is made harder for the year 6's as this could be the last time they see some of their friends, as they are going to many different schools. They are also feeling a bit invincible - being at the very top of the school, the big fish in a little pond if you like. And at the same time, deep down they know that soon they will be the 'little fish' again, as they start secondary school, where many of the children already there, are much bigger and bolder than they have experienced so far.

At their leaver's service in Church, each child is given the opportunity to talk about some of the most memorable things that have happened during their time at St Stephen's Junior School, or to talk about what they are looking forward to most at their new school or in their future.

As you might imagine, the tears flow and the hugs are held a little longer, as the reality of saying goodbye begins to hit home. And it's the same for the parents, teachers and their Vicar, as together, we have seen the children grow over the years.

It has been a real delight and joy to watch the children mature and become confident young people, who I know will be a real asset to the secondary schools they will be moving on to.

One of the things that I have been reflecting on is the contribution that each individual child makes to the life of the school, they all leave a little piece of them behind and the school is richer for them having been part of it.

When school returns after the summer holidays things will have changed, we will have a new year 6 and a new intake in each school year and with a new group of children starting school for the first time. Please will you pray for all of the children, not just in our church school, St Stephen's Junior, but for all who will be moving on to secondary school in September as well as those who will be starting school for the first time.

School days may be long behind most of us but changes and milestones are things we all face; houses may change hands, people will come and go... but each of us leaves a footprint behind us.

Memories live on and we all contribute something of our self to the communities we find ourselves in.

You all contribute to the life of this Parish because St Stephen's Church is the church for the whole community, and you make it what it is!!

Ecclesiastes CHAPTER 3

A reading in the book of Ecclesiastes in the Bible, talks about how there is a time and purpose for everything.

This is something I find quite helpful to think about, especially when I am faced with change.

Seasons come and go, we come and go, we move onto new seasons in our life, just as the year 6 children will do but each season helps to shape us and we add something to it.


