VALENTINE'S DAY takes place on Wednesday the 14th of February. God is the creator of all things, so he is the one responsible for the emotional love that we feel in any relationship.

THE love of God, however, goes so much deeper than the emotional love that we think of on Valentine's Day.

I would therefore like to share my thoughts on *The Great Love Of God*, after all 'God is love, and all who live in love live in God, and God lives in them.'

To understand and to know the way in which God loves us has been a blessing to me and this knowledge has sustained me through the toughest times of ministry and life. I will focus on the love of God under three different headings.

These three headings are:

- God's Love as a Foundation,
- God's Commandment of Love
- God's Everlasting Love.

Each heading will be attached to a scripture which will give us insight into God's love. Looking at God's love from these three perspectives will help us to see the gift of God's love to us, and will also help us to understand the responsibility that we have been given to share this love with those around us.

### God's Love as a Foundation IOHN 3:16~17

'For God so loved the world that he gave his one and only Son, that whoever

believes in him shall not perish but have eternal life. For God did not send his Son into the world to condemn the world, but to save the world through him.'

This scripture speaks to us about the way in which God showed his love to us by sending his Son down to earth.

These words also explain Jesus' purpose, he came so that we may not perish but have eternal life and he came to earth so that we may be saved from all sin and guilt. Perhaps the greatest thing we can take from this passage from John is the fact that Jesus came to earth to die for us.

The death of Christ is the ultimate display of how deep God loves each one of us. Early into ministry, as I began to read my bible, and as I began to understand what Jesus went through on the cross, I realised the true depth of God's love.

This love became my foundation and the driving force in everything I did afterwards.

I believe that once we make the love of God our foundation then all our actions will flow out of his love for us.

### God's Commandment of Love

MATTHEW 22:37~40

"Jesus replied, 'Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind.'

This is the first and greatest commandment. And the second is like it:

'Love your neighbour as yourself.'
All the Law and the Prophets hang on these two commandments."

### SUNDAY 18 FEBRUARY 1st Sunday of Lent

Genesis 9:8-17; Psalm 25:1-9
I Peter 3:18-end; Mark 1:9-15
HEAVENLY FATHER, your Son battled with the powers of darkness, and grew closer to you in the desert: help us to use these days to grow in wisdom and prayer that we may witness to your saving love in Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

### SUNDAY 25 FEBRUARY 2nd Sunday of Lent

Genesis 17:1-7, 15-16; Psalm 22:23-end Romans 4:13-end; Mark 8:31-end ALMIGHTY GOD, by the prayer and discipline of Lent may we enter into the mystery of Christ's sufferings, and by following in his Way come to share in his glory; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.



Under this second heading, we see Jesus talking about the greatest commandment and the one which follows it, both of them are about love.

Jesus does this to highlight how important it is to carry love in our hearts firstly for God and then for those around us.

Once we realise the great love that God has for us and make it our foundation, we are then given the challenges of firstly loving God with all that we are and then sharing God's love with those around us.

When I read these words of Jesus, I recognise that I have struggled and continue to struggle with both commandments.

Indeed, I say that I love God but, at certain points in my life, my actions have not corresponded with my words.

Often, I have done things which I know are not the right things to do.

When it comes to loving those around me, I struggle with this too.

I find it easy to love people when everything is going well but when things happen which cause hurt then I struggle to love.

Even though we may face these struggles when it comes to love, I think it is our duty as Christians to continue to strive to walk in the ways of God and to love those around us as best as we can.

Alongside this, we can pray to God asking him to help us especially when it is difficult to love.

### **God's Everlasting Love** ROMANS 8:37~39

'No, in all these things we are more than conquerors through him who loved us.

For I am convinced that neither death nor life, neither angels nor demons, neither the present nor the future, nor any powers, neither height nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God that is in Christ Jesus our Lord.'

These verses under the heading The Everlasting Love of God are some of the best verses that have stuck with me throughout my faith journey.

In this passage, the words of Paul speak of the true depth in which God loves us. Paul shows us that nothing can ever separate us from the love of God which is found in Christ Jesus our Lord.

To follow God has been the greatest thing that I have ever done in my life but at the same time, it has been the most difficult thing that I have done. I struggled when I was at theological college, I felt like giving up on ministry often and I continue to struggle with stepping out of my comfort zones. Through all these challenges, this scripture has stuck in my mind.

At my lowest points when I felt like giving up, and when I felt like I could not carry on, these words would always come to mind.

It is an amazing source of strength and joy to know that whatever we may face, nothing in the world or beyond can ever separate us from God's love for us.

THEREFORE, on Valentine's Day as we think about that emotional love that we have for those who are close to us, or as we think of the love that we receive from family and friends, may we be reminded of the deeper love that God has for each one of us.

This love of God is not the type of love that we should celebrate once a year, but is the type of love that we should celebrate daily.

Knowing that we are deeply loved and having the foundation of God's love in our lives is the key to the growth of the Kingdom of Heaven. No matter what we face in life and no matter what is ahead of us, may we always remember the scripture from Romans chapter 8 verse 31, which states, 'If God is for us, who can be against us?'

### Ways of giving to God

### THROUGH HIS CHURCH...

**B**EING 'Thankful and Grateful' to God for all that He has freely given to us, both in provision for all our needs AND in Jesus, means that we, like Him, can become **Generous** people.

Generous with our time; Generous with our love; Generous in our speaking; Generous in our thinking; Generous in our ways; Generous in sharing what we have.

In other words, we become Generous, just as God is Generous with us. Our gratitude to God overflows into Generosity.

Your Church, which is not just me or the ministry team, but all of us as the Body of Christ in this place, are called to make Christ known and loved.

To do that, here in Soundwell, in all the places we spend time, and also in reaching out to support others in need wherever that might be... that work does cost money. Some of the costs are obvious to see, like heat and light in Church and the maintenance of the buildings. Other costs like paying our 'Parish Share', means clergy are recruited, trained and provided to parishes, along with essential on-going training and resources that our Church needs to keep itself fresh, relevant – and growing.

This building was paid for by our forebears many years ago.

It is only still here today, because it has been carefully maintained by generations of faithful Christians here in Soundwell.

Without our Generosity, the Church collapses. And with it, all the amazing work the Holy Spirit enables us to do in the Lord's name here, and further afield.

There are many ways to Give to God through your Church.

You can put money into the collection plates in Church or use the QR code displayed on the stands to give using a smart phone, or use the donations paypoint

machine near the Font to give from a bank card or credit card or from your phone.

But, to enable us as a church to be able to budget and be secure in the knowledge we can pay our bills, we highly commend the first of the following two options:

### **Parish Giving Scheme (PGS)**









THIS is a direct debit scheme from your bank account each month which enables you to give regularly and review annually and also means no scrabbling for cash or needing to remember!

The majority of us choose to give in this way, as it helps us as individuals and it is a huge help to your church—less time spent counting, having to carry less cash is safer for our treasurer, and also the church receives the 'gift aid' income monthly.

**PGS** also prompts us to review our giving each year, which many of us welcome as otherwise we might forget.

In this way, we can think this through with God in prayer each year—about our response to God's goodness through his church—and it's a joy in thinking all things through with God in prayer at any time!

### **Collection Envelopes**

YOU can enclose your donation every week and just take them all to Church when you can. It's also important to review what you give.

But there is no reminder with envelopes, so you have to manage that yourself—so why not do this annually when you receive your new set of envelopes?


