AS I approach the time of my ordination to become a Priest, I would like to share some of my thoughts on, and also highlight the differences and similarities between, being a Deacon, and being a Priest.

IN THIS reflection I will also share my feelings as I get closer to my ordination. In order to find the similarities and the differences of a Deacon and a Priest, it is important to examine the order of service for the ordination of a Deacon and the order of service for the ordination of a Priest. Both these orders of service describe the roles and expectations of the person who is being ordained.

So I begin with similarities.

Out of the many things of ministry that I love, preaching sermons and telling the story of God is near the top of my list.

The power of words has always been fascinating to me and I feel privileged to be able to speak the words of God to people.

The order of service for a Deacon states: 'Deacons are to proclaim the gospel in word and deed, as agents of God's purposes of love?

The order of service for a Priest states: 'Priests are to unfold scriptures, preach the word in season and out of season, and to declare the mighty acts of God.'

As a Priest, I look forward to continuing to preach sermons and telling the amazing story of God's love and his mighty acts.

DURING this past year, I have had the opportunity to be involved with many of the mission projects around the church. Some of these include The Lent Group, The Noise, Outburst, Confirmation Classes and preparing families for Baptism. Alongside this, I have been privileged to go into Soundwell Academy and the other schools within the community to engage with the young people there.

I have also been doing chaplaincy at HMP Bristol which has been a blessing for me to encourage people who are at a low point of their lives.

The role of a Deacon and a Priest both include the important responsibility of doing mission.

The following is expected of a Deacon: 'Deacons are to serve the community in which they are set, bringing to the Church the needs and hopes of all people. They accompany those searching for faith and bring them to Baptism'.

The following is expected of a Priest:

'They are to be messengers, watchmen and stewards of the Lord; they are to teach and to admonish, to feed and provide for his family, to search for his children in the wilderness of this world's temptation, and to guide them through its confusions, that they may be saved through Christ for ever. They are to resist evil, support the weak, defend the poor, and intercede for all in need. They are to minister to the sick and prepare the dying for their death.'

ON becoming a Priest, I will need to maintain the importance of mission and continue to meet people where they are.

I look forward to these tasks as I believe that there is nothing more important than telling people how much God loves them.

One of the main responsibilities of a Deacon is to serve people and to serve alongside people.



As a Deacon in Soundwell, I serve alongside the other members of the ministry team and I also serve the church community and the wider community.

This calling to serve does not end when I am ordained as a Priest, it continues throughout my time in ministry.

I thank God for my calling to serve as I see it as a privilege and an honour.

Though I continue to serve people, becoming a Priest carries with it **different** responsibilities.

The order of service states:

'Priests are called to be servants and shepherds among the people to whom they are sent. With their Bishop and fellow ministers, they are to proclaim the word of the Lord and to watch for the signs of God's new creation.'

Through these words, it is clear to see that the responsibilities of a Priest are similar to a shepherd.

A shepherd not only leads, guides and protects, but they also feed and comfort. As a priest, it is important for me to recognise my call and role as a leader and a shepherd. As well as recognising, I aim to grow and flourish in this call.

There are many things I look forward to being able to do once I become a priest such as weddings and presiding at communion.

The privilege of presiding at communion holds a special place in my heart.

The order of service states:

Priests are to preside at the Lord's table and lead his people in worship, offering with them a spiritual sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving.'

The sacrifice that Jesus made on the cross for our sins has always been an important focus point in my faith life. I, like many people, have made a lot of mistakes in my life. However, through the sacrifice of Jesus, I know that my sins are washed away, I have been forgiven and I am fully loved by God.

Therefore, to be able to preside at communion and give thanks to God for the sacrifice of Jesus is truly an amazing part of being a Priest. Finally, I would like to end this reflection with firstly a quote from John Pritchard and secondly some personal words. Speaking about a Priest, John Pritchard states:

'The Priest is someone who has been dazzled by the beauty of God and longs to reveal that beauty in the world.'

My first year in Soundwell has been a great experience. There have been challenges but it has been a joy for me to learn and grow in such a friendly and welcoming church.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank all the people in the church community and in the wider community who have loved me, supported me, prayed for me and helped me to be the man of God that I am growing into.

May God continue to bless each one of you. Amen.


to be an important part of the Communion Service and therefore wish to give as many people as possible the opportunity to take part, and I want to ensure that I ask everyone who would be willing.

Exploring Christianity

'Exploring Christianity' will be starting again in September. It is a discipleship course for those wanting to learn more about their faith and the Bible.



There are 6 modules (one per term) covering Spirituality, New and Old Testaments, Doctrine, the Church and Ethics.

Each module costs $\pounds 50$ (or $\pounds 25$ if not doing assignments) and all six are usually completed over a two year period.

The course is an essential theological study for those considering a Licensed Lay Ministry but can also provide an educational reference for those considering ordination. However, it is also an open access course for *anyone* who just wishes to learn more about their faith!

This will be the last opportunity to do the current course before a new diocesan course starts in 2025.

There will be groups in Bristol, one in Swindon and one on zoom.


